Updated International Travel Policy and Reminders

Please note the following policy adjustments concerning international travel:

- International Travel must be approved prior to submitting an abstract to a meeting, accepting a formal initiation to attend, registering for a meeting, or incurring any other travel expenses
- Justification forms and attachments must be submitted to the ITC no later than the 15th of the month **prior to the month of travel**; all international travel must go through the ITC regardless of funding
- Travel to Mexico and Canada does not require approval by the ITC



Pediatrics and Medicine at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, JC Peterson Endowed Chair, and founder and director of the Vanderbilt- Meharry Sickle Cell Disease Center of ExcellenceHe has been the principal investigator or co-leader of eight NHI or foundation-funded controlled clinical trials designed to prevent strokes in children or adults with sickle cell disease in North America, Europe, and Nigeria. Dr. DeBaun is an elected member of the National Academy of Medicine (2009). Dr. DeBaun has received two international mentoring awards: the Maureen Andrews Award from the Society of Pediatric Research (2017) and the American Society of Hematology Clinical Science Research Mentor Award (2019). In 2019, he received the Stanford University Medical School Lifetime Achievement Award.
