Zachary Danlels, MD, is board certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Critical Care. After earning his medical degree at LSU School of Medicine, Dr. Daniels completed his Pediatric residency at IU Riley Hospital for Children. He then furthered his training at Lurie Children's Hospital in Chicago with fellowships in Pediatric Critical Care and Neurocritical Care. He returned to New Orleans as an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at LSU Health New Orleans in 2021. Danlella Miller, MD, MPH, is board-certified in Child Neurology and Epilepsy. She currently serves as assistant professor of Clinical Neurology and Neurophysiology at LSU Health Sciences Center New Orleans. She completed her undergraduate training at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Miller received her medical degree as well as a masters in public health from Tulane University School of Medicine. She performed her pediatric residency training at Children's National Medical Center in Washington, D.C., followed by a residency in Child Neurology and Fellowship in Clinical Neurophysiology at LSU Health Sciences Center New Orleans.

**Objectives:** At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Define status epilepticus and associated definitions as outlined by the International League Against Epilepsy
- Describe the general phases of therapy from the prehospital setting to the pediatric ICU
- Understand why prolonged seizures are more difficult to treat and why early therapy is paramount to seizure cessation
- Describe possible causes of status epilepticus and be able to create a differential diagnosis for refractory status epilepticus

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.

Your copy should address 3 key questions: Who am I writing for? (Audience) Why should they care? (Benefit) What do I want them to do here? (Call-to-Action)

Create a great offer by adding words like "free" "personalized" "complimentary" or "customized." A sense of urgency often helps readers take an action, so think about inserting phrases like "for a limited time only" or "only 7 remaining"!

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
