

CHNOLA Announcements

Important EPIC Update Which Will Cause a Dramatic Change in Creatinine Clearance

Situation/Background: Last month at CHNOLA, a 2 month old patient in PICU had a calculated creatinine clearance (CrCl) that did not appear to be correct. Pharmacy reviewed the equation from Epic to double check the calculations. It was determined this was artifact build from 2016. The bedside Schwartz equation is now recommended for which a system change has been approved.

Action: The update to this equation will be moved into Epic production on November 8th.

Recommendation: When this change takes place you will notice a decrease in the calculated CrCl which is a more accurate reflection of a patient's current renal function. Please feel free to contact your clinical pharmacist or central pharmacy if you have questions or concerns about this change and would like assistance reviewing a patient's medication list for renal dose adjustments.
