Maribeth Nicholson, MD, MPH, is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the Division of Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology, and Nutrition at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Dr. Nicholson attended medical school at Penn State College of Medicine, then continued her training with Internship and Residency in Pediatrics at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. She additionally earned her Masters of Public Health degree while completing her Fellowship in Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology, and Nutrition at Vanderbilt.

She has previously conducted both retrospective and prospective studies evaluating pediatric *C. difficile* infections which were completed through a highly competitive T32 training grant and the Thrasher Early Career Award. Dr. Nicholson is currently the Pl of a National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases grant. In 2020 she was inducted into the Society for Pediatric Research.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe factors influencing current C. difficile infection incidence.
- Understand limitations of diagnostic testing for C. difficile.
- Discuss the safety and efficacy of feral microbiota transplantation for *C. difficile* in children
