Alexis Morvant, MD, MA, FAAP, is the Service Line Chief of Pediatric Palliative Care Medicine at CHNOLA and an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the Department of Pediatrics at LSU Health Sciences Center. Dr. Morvant earned her Master of Arts degree in Bioethics from Loyola Marymount University before beginning her medical education at LSU Health Sciences Center New Orleans. Dr. Morvant continued her training at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine for her Pediatric Residency. She also completed an Interdisciplinary Hospice and Palliative Care, Pediatric Track Fellowship at Harvard Medical School/Boston Children's.

Dr. Morvant returned to New Orleans in 2018 to create and build a robust pediatric palliative care team. She has been recognized by regional and national organizations for her work in education, advocacy, and leadership. Dr. Morvant shared, "My patients can count on me to provide extraordinary care because I'm here for the patient and their entire family to create an individualized extraordinary care plan based on their own unique values, culture and spirituality."

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Understand what palliative care is and how it is similar yet different than hospice
- Describe historicity of pediatric palliative care at Children's Hospital: How did we get here? Where are we now? Where do we hope to go?
- Develop primary palliative care skills that can be useful within your practice
- Appreciate how the language we choose to use in medicine is impactful and can be life-altering for our patients and their families

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
