2023 Faculty Annual Performance Evaluations

LSU School of Medicine is devoted to your success and as such, is committed to a performance feedback process for ongoing improvement. Faculty members have received several emails with information related to the Annual Faculty Performance Evaluation Process, one from Human Resources and the other from the LSU Dean's office outlining the purpose and process. All faculty must have an evaluation form completed by their direct supervisor (Division Head, Chair, Dean, etc.) and submitted to LSU Human Resources.

For Division Heads:

 Please complete the <u>evaluation form</u> for each division member using Adobe Acrobat

- 2. Return to Kelly Allerton (kslumb@lsuhsc.edu) by March 13th. (Department must upload all forms by March 15th).
- 3. To assist with completion, there are training videos and sessions
- 4. There are 6 categories of performance, of which the first 3 have modifiable percent effort and must total 70%.
- 5. The score range is 1 5; note, a score of 1, 4, and 5 require comments; an overall total score of 5 warrants a second reviewer (Chair signature)
- 6. Please meet and review with your faculty; both of you must sign the form.

For Faculty:

- 1. Read the <u>evaluation form</u> and consider completing a self-evaluation to enhance your professional development.
- 2. For those of you who do not have a current Division Head, Dr. Desselle will complete your evaluation

Note for all: this does not replace the annual faculty review form which will be conducted at the end of the academic year and is a necessary component of the promotion process.

LSU Pediatrics was well represented at this year's Southern Regional Meeting, held Feb 2-4 at the New Orleans Hotel Intercontinental. Congratulations to our award winners!! Dr. Kathryn Cyrus received the SSPR Trainee Travel Award. **Dr. Anne Tufton** received the Southern Society for Pediatric Research (SSPR) Young Faculty Travel Award and was invited to present her work at the SSCI/SSPR joint Showcase of Science (one of only 6 presentations selected for this honor). Trainees and faculty representing LSU Pediatrics delivered total а presentations including 15 oral presentations. A list of titles is included below. Our trainees were well prepared thanks to a formal mentoring session developed by **Dr. Bonnie Desselle** and hosted by Children's Hospital on Jan 26th. At this session, 11 trainees (medical students, residents, and fellows) signed up to present a "practice" version of their platform presentation. Each trainee received formal feedback from at least 2 faculty members in addition to immediate verbal feedback from the audience (faculty and trainees). Many trainees voiced that they found the session incredibly valuable.

Several LSU Pediatrics faculty held leadership roles at the SRM.**Dr. Marcie Houser**, as a member of the Academic Pediatric Association, served as an Abstract Reviewer and moderated the Adolescent Medicine and Pediatrics Symposium. As a member of the SSPR, **Dr. Julie Gallois** served as Lead

Mary Younger-Rossl, MD, is a board-certified pediatrician who specializes in Endocrinology and the treatment of children with obesity. Dr. Younger-Rossi earned her medical degree from the University of Texas. She continued her training at Tulane University to complete her Pediatric Residency.

Dr. Younger-Rossi now serves as an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at Tulane University School of Medicine. She is also the Section Chief of Community Pediatrics and Global Health and the physician on staff at the Pediatric Weight Clinic.
