COMSEP and AAPD have recently released guidelines for Letters of Recommendation (LORs) in Pediatrics in hopes of helping letter writers and selection committees







communicate meaningfully and efficiently. <u>See here to</u> view these guidelines.

It is intended that these guidelines will standardize expectations for LORs, provide a shared structure for communicating about students, provide a tool for faculty development, and mitigate bias in letter writing through enhanced awareness.



These guidelines are not mandatory. As of now, faculty may use these guidelines, or not, as they wish.
