LSU Pediatrics and CHNOLA cheered on the LSU Tigers ahead of the National Championship yesterday in the Lauricella Pavillion.









Dr. Sarah Dumas announced she will serve as the Associate Medical Director for Louisiana Medicaid, and will have joint appointments in the Department of Medicine, Section of Community and Population Medicine as well as the LSUHSC Center for Healthcare Value and Equity. The majority of her time will be focused on providing strategic leadership around key initiatives related to continuous quality improvement, population health, and heath equity, including the integration and implementation of social determinants of health screening, and integration of community health worker

support into Medicaid-funded care. She will also continue caring for general pediatric and adolescent patients at the Kids First TigerCARE clinic and participate in resident and medical student education.
