Jessica Zagory, MD, is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Surgery for LSUHSC New Orleans Department of Surgery. She also serves as Associate Program Directory for LSU's General Surgery Residency. She joined Children's from her former position as clinical fellow in pediatric surgery at University of Texas Southwestern/ Children's Medical Center Dallas. Dr. Zagory completed residency training in general surgery at LSU, spending time at Children's Hospital during her training. In addition to residency and clinical fellowship training, Dr. Zagory has completed a research fellowship in pediatric surgery at the University of Southern California / Children's Hospital Los Angeles. At Children's Hospital New Orleans, her areas of clinical focus include hepatobiliary disease and trauma.

The Dean of the School of Medicine has put into place four institution grant mechanisms to provide support for faculty research: (1) Bridge Grants, (2) New Project Grants, and (3) Clinical Research Grants. Dr. Backes will provide an overview of the successful application process. A panel of faculty who have successfully applied for intramural funding, both basic and clinical projects, will discuss how best to navigate the internal funding system. Panelists will also discuss any issues with their applications and how to avoid them. Research funding includes Research Enhancement Grants, Translational Sciences Center (LACaTS Pilot Grants), Leveraging Innovation for Technology Transfer (LIFT2) Grants, Bioinformatics Pilot Grants, Botanica Research Resources Workshop for clinical and basic science faculty members and residents.



RCR (required for NIH training grants) and DEI are important to discuss before embarking on any type of research, especially involving health disparities. Panel discussions will include how to incorporate RCR and DEI in 1) Research design: e.g., which populations will be studied to address health disparities/needs, 2) Methods: e.g., recruitment, consenting participants, evaluation tools, and data collection, 3) Results and Conclusions: e.g., interpretation of results; data analysis, 4) Communication/presentation of your results to the scientific community and the lay public.
