Marcus Bachhuber, MD, MSHP, is the Chief Medical Officer for Louisiana Medicaid. Dr. Bacchuber also serves as Assistant Professor of Clinical Medicine in LSUHSC Department of Medicine and Assistant Professor in LSUHSC School of Public Health. He specializes in Addiction Medicine.

Dr. Bachhuber earned his MD from University of Pennsylvania Perelman School of Medicine before completing his Primary Care/Social Internal Medicine residency at Montefiore Medical Center in Bronx, New York. He returned to Perelman School of Medicine for his Master of Science in Health Policy Research. Having previously served on faculty at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York, he moved to Louisiana in 2018. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

RCR (required for NIH training grants) and DEI are important to discuss before embarking on any type of research, especially involving health disparities. Panel discussions will include how to incorporate RCR and DEI in 1) Research design: e.g., which populations will be studied to address health disparities/needs, 2) Methods: e.g., recruitment, consenting participants, evaluation tools, and data collection, 3) Results and Conclusions: e.g., interpretation of results; data analysis, 4) Communication/presentation of your results to the scientific community and the lay public.
