John Vanchiere, MD, PhD, is a second-generation pediatrician from Lake Charles, LA. He is a Professor of Pediatrics at LSUHSC-Shreveport and serves as Adjunct Professor in the Department of Pharmacology, Toxicology, and Neurosciences at Shreveport as well. Dr. Vanchiere served as the President of the Louisiana Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics from 2017-2019.

Dr. Vanchiere earned his Bachelors of Science in Chemistry at Tulane University. He then earned his PhD in Neuroscience and his MD in a dual program at Emory University in Atlanta. Dr. Vanchiere completed his General Pediatrics residency and Pediatric Infectious Disease fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Identify the clinical manifestations of COVID-19 infection and MIS-C
- Discuss the importance of COVID-19 vaccines for children
- Address vaccine hesitancy related to vaccination of children against COVID-19

RCR (required for NIH training grants) and DEI are important to discuss before embarking on any type of research, especially involving health disparities. Panel discussions will include how to incorporate RCR and DEI in 1) Research design: e.g., which populations will be studied to address health disparities/needs, 2) Methods: e.g., recruitment, consenting participants, evaluation tools, and data collection, 3) Results and Conclusions: e.g., interpretation of results; data analysis, 4) Communication/presentation of your results to the scientific community and the lay public.
