Ricardo Gomez Named Acting Chief of the Section of Pediatric Endocrinology

Effective, April 2, 2021, Ricardo Gomez, MD, will assume leadership of the LSU Section of Pediatric Endocrinology as Acting Chief of the Section, replacing Dr. Stuart Chalew.

Ricardo is a native of Columbia. He graduated medical school at the Pontifica Universidad Javeriana School of Medicine in Bogota. He completed his Pediatric

Residency and Chief Residency at the Pediatric University Hospital, "Lorencita Villegas de Santos" at the Colegio Mayor de Nuestra Señora del Rosario in Bogota, Columbia. Ricardo immigrated to the United States where he completed Pediatric Endocrinology Fellowship and additional Pediatric Residency training at LSU Health New Orleans. After a period as a Pediatric Endocrinologist in Columbia he was recruited back to the LSU Department of Pediatrics in Baton Rouge as an Assistant Professor in 2003 and transitioned to LSU Health New Orleans in 2007. Ricardo currently serves as an Associate Professor of Pediatrics. Since 2019, Dr. Gomez has served as Service Line Chief of Pediatric Endocrinology at Children's Hospital of New Orleans. Ricardo is universally recognized as an outstanding clinician and faculty member.

Dr. Stuart Chalew is stepping down as Pediatric Endocrinology Section Head after 24 years of service to allow him to concentrate more time and energy on his successful research initiatives. During his tenure, Stuart has dedicated his

career to the children of Louisiana and the development of academic pediatric endocrinology at LSU Health New Orleans and the Children's Hospital. He has agreed to continue as a senior mentor for Dr. Gomez.
