From the Chair: Remember our Oath of Hippocrates

As I listened to the Zoom Medical School Graduation Ceremony last week <u>\$ee</u> <u>program and list of students and honors</u>), I was reminded of the words of the Oath of Hippocrates, that we all recited at our own graduations.

Maybe worth a few minutes to remember during these trying times. Our task if very clear.

Oath of Hippocrates

I do solemnly swear by whatever I hold most sacred, that I will be loyal to the profession of medicine and will be just and generous to its members and will teach those who follow after me in this practice. That I will lead my life and practice my art in uprightness and honor. That into whatever home I shall enter, it shall be for the good of the sick and of the well and to the utmost of my power I will hold myself aloof from wrong and corruption and from tempting others to vice. That I will exercise my art solely for the cure of my patients and for the prevention of disease. I will give no drug or perform no operation for a criminal purpose, and will never recommend such a thing.

That whatever I shall see or hear that concerns the lives of my patients which is not fitting to be spoken, I will keep forever secret. These things I do promise in proportion to the degree that I am faithful to this oath, may happiness and good repute be ever mine, and may the opposite befall me if I am false to my word.

Students are Back!

Clerkship Director Dr. Amy Prudhomme reports that LSU medical students have re-entered clinical care as of yesterday, May 18. They will have a shortened clerkship with the goal to complete their required clinical competencies for the remainder of their 3rd year. Call duties will not be required and if a virtual experience is available, students should be involved in that manner. She asks that all faculty review the attached guidelines from both LSU as well as CHNOLA Office of Medical Education regarding keeping students and patients safe as well as guidelines for use of PPE.

A few key points:

- 1. Students may not see any patient suspected of having COVID.
- 2. Students as well as patients and visitors must remained masked during the encounter.
