LSU Pediatrics Announcements

Divisions of Endocrinology and Cardiology Awarded a Research Enhancement Program Grant from LSUHSC School of Medicine









The Sections of Pediatric Endocrinology and Pediatric Cardiology have been awarded a grant of \$74,602 from the LSU School of Medicine - Research Enhancement Program (REP) for a period of up to two years to study the

possible racial disparities in the presence of early markers and progression of cardiovascular complications between African American (AA) patients and non-Hispanic white (NHW) patients. The Section of Pediatric Endocrinology at LSU was the first to show that there is a consistently higher HbA1c in AA pediatric patients compared to NHW despite similar levels of mean blood glucose. This difference in glycation of HbA1c between AA and NHW is likely an additional factor involved in the racial disparity of microvascular and macrovascular complications. The data from this study will provide us with the unique ability to track development and progression of early macrovascular pathology and explore factors which exacerbate or ameliorate pathology in pediatric diabetes. The development and refinement of these clinical tools is also an important step needed before the effectiveness of targeted therapeutic interventions can be determined.
