June is LGBTQ Pride Month!

Did you know that LGBTQ youth are more likely than their peers to experience negative health and life outcomes? They are at an increased risk for depression and suicide, bullying, substance use, sexual health risks and homelessness. According to the Human Rights Center's 2017 LGBTQ Youth Survey:



- 77% of LGBTQ teenagers surveyed report feeling depressed or down over the past week
- 95% of LGBTQ youth report trouble sleeping at night
- More than 70% report feelings of worthlessness and hopelessness in the past week
- 67% report that they've heard family members make negative comments about LGBTQ people

Healthcare providers have unique opportunity to positively impact the lives and futures of LGBTQ youth by fostering a safe, welcoming environment and providing evidence-based, culturally competent care.
