2021 LSU Pediatrics Faculty Wellness Survey Results



Two versions of this year's survey results are available: short version and long version.

Key points:

- 1. Almost one third of our faculty are demonstrating evidence of burnout in at least one measure.
- 2. Almost all of our faculty have exceptionally high emotional thriving and emotional resilience (burnout is not because you aren't strong enough-you are really strong).
- 3. We will continue to work to impact our work environment to make your work lives better. The job is difficult but worth all of our efforts.

4. If you are feeling stressed by your job, please reach out for help. The final slide of each report has the LSU Campus Assistance Program contact information. The Campus Assistance Program is totally confidential and meant to serve as a resource to us in time of need. Based on the survey, a few of our faculty express burnout on almost a daily basis-if that is you-reach out to Campus Assistance.

Thanks to Jerussa Aita-Levy and all of our faculty who think about and lead wellness initiatives on a daily basis. Look out for your colleagues and friends. Reach out for help. Keep making our work place safer and better.

SPR Launches New PROSPER Diversity Award PRomotion of Fellows' PEdiatric Research

The Society of Pediatric Research has announced a new \$7,500 SPR PROSPER Diversity Award to advance their mission of creating a multi-disciplinary network of diverse researchers to improve child health. In 2021 one award will be made to an under-represented in medicine fellow pursuing a pediatric research career path. Award funds will be matched by the Awardee's organization, yielding a total of \$15,000 in research support.

In addition to this financial support SPR will provide the SPR PROSPER Diversity Awardee with mentoring over the course of a twelve-month pediatric research project. This dual-support approach is intended to facilitate a pediatric academic research-focused career trajectory for fellows from underrepresented in medicine background(s) and to increase the diversity of the pediatric researcher workforce. Pennington/Louisiana NORC Announces Grant Program for Underrepresented Groups

The <u>Pennington/Louisiana NORC</u> is pleased to announce a Pilot and Feasibility Grant Program to establish opportunities designed to increase the number of investigators from underrepresented groups and/or disadvantaged backgrounds as well as individuals with disabilities. The full text of the Application Instructions can be found <u>here.</u>

The major objective of this program is to provide research support to develop preliminary data and/or novel methods to early career scientists (including senior post-doctoral fellows; >1.5y) from underrepresented groups involving nutrition/obesity-related research.

The NORC will give highest priority to research related to nutrition/obesity throughout the lifespan. The P&F awards are intended to generate preliminary data for the investigator to obtain extramural research funding from the NIH (e.g., R01).

- Funding Available: \$100,000
- Submission: Apply through the Pennington NORC P&F web portal
