
Welcome, New Faculty!


LSUHSC COVID Self-Reporting

Scott Schultz, MD, specializes in Pediatric Rehabilitation at Children's Hospital. He earned his medical degree from George Washington University in Washington, D.C., and completed his residency training at UCLA/VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare Center. He then completed a fellowship in Pediatric Rehabilitation at Kennedy Krieger Institute/Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Schultz is board-certified and serves as the Associate Director of Rehabilitation Program at Children's Hospital.

When asked why he chose to practice Pediatric Rehabilitation, Dr. Schultz said, "During my training, I became interested in traumatic brain injuries and concussions in children. I've enjoyed working with these patients and their family members to help get them back to their normal routines." Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe how to acutely manage a concussion.
 Identify the difference between concussion, postconcussion syndrome, and chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE)
- Describe the return to play protocol and when it should be implemented regarding concussion

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
