Stuart Slavin MD, MEd is Senior Scholar for Well-being at the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). A graduate of Saint Louis University School of Medicine, Dr. Slavin completed his residency training in pediatrics at UCLA and then served as a faculty member there for seventeen years before returning to Saint Louis University as Associate Dean for Curriculum.

While at SLU, Dr. Slavin led efforts to improve the mental health of medical students that produced dramatic decreases in rates of depression and anxiety in pre-clerkship students. He joined the ACGME in 2018 and is helping to lead efforts to improve the mental health of residents and faculty across the US.

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Objectives

- At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to: 1. Identify common mindsets and automatic thoughts that can contribute to distress
- Identify and describe environmental factors in medicine that can contribute to distress
- 3. Describe the three steps of cognitive restructuring.
