
Gary Duhon Promoted to Role of Chief of the Section of Pediatric Critical Care



Dr. Stopa contributed 34 years of service to LSU, Children's Hospital and the children of Louisiana, while Dr. Begue completed more than 25 years of faculty service.

Dr. Thomas Kimball recently shared his sentiments as Dr. Stopa planned his retirement...

It's time to celebrate the career of Dr. Aluizio Stopa as he nears his retirement on July 31, 2020. Dr. Stopa was born and raised in Brazil. His undergraduate education and medical education were at the Academy of Commerce and the Faculty of Medicine of the Federal University of Juiz de Fora respectively and both in Brazil. His pediatric internship/residency was across three institutions: Babies Hospital In New York City, Albert Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia and Cincinnati Children's Hospital. He performed his pediatric cardiology fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital as well.

Following his training, he became an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at LSUHSC and Medical Director of Cardiology at CHNOLA. In 1984 he worked a brief two year stint as the Director of Cardiac Rehabilitation in Birmingham, AL before rejoining LSUHSC and CHNOLA in 1986. He has remained on the LSUHSC faculty ever since.

A true testimony to Dr. Stopa's legacy after a total of 40 years with LSUHSC and pediatric cardiology lies with how his patients feel about his retirement. They are all very sad that he will no longer be caring for them and cherish the years that he has been their doctor.

In retirement, Dr. Stopa will enjoy his daily walks along the Audubon bike path, exercising on his Power Plate and stationary bicycle at home and watching his favorite show, Forensic Files, and his favorite sports teams, the Cincinnati Reds and, of course, the Saints! Who Dat! We Dat! Dr. Stopa Dat!

We wish Dr. Stopa a very happy retirement and thank him for his many years of devoted service to the Department of Pediatrics and Children's Hospital of New Orleans.

Important Notice: P-Card Restrictions on AAP Purchases

Recently, changes to the American Academy of Pediatrics on-line purchase process will limit the use of the LSU Department of Pediatrics credit card (P-Card) to American Academy of Pediatrics membership renewals only.

Since LSU is a State Agency, it does not pay State sales taxes on purchases. Thus, the LSU P-Card can't pay sales taxes. The AAP is now processing state sales taxes on all purchases except membership dues renewals. Therefore, all other AAP purchases of faculty members (books, subscriptions, etc) must be purchased directly by the individual faculty member. Then, receipts can be submitted for reimbursement of the expenses.

AAP membership renewals can continue via the P-Card at this point.

This policy is in effect regardless of what State account (LSU or LSU Foundation) is used to reimburse faculty members for expenses.
