Blocking Microsoft Teams Add-in

If you're having trouble figuring out why a Teams meeting was sent in your Outlook calendar invitation even though you included your Zoom meeting link, you are not alone! Turns out Microsoft Outlook automatically adds a Teams meeting to all calendar items when attendees are invited. This results in your attendees entering two different meetings, one in Zoom and one in Teams.

Here is how to disable the add-in:

- 1. In Outlook, click File, Options.
- 2. Click Calendar on the left.
- 3. Under Calendar options, uncheck the box next to "Add online meeting to all meetings."
- 4. Click OK at the bottom.

"The Hidden Biases of Good People: Implications for Medical Professionals"

Wednesday, August 10, 2022 Large Conference Rooms, Noon



This Grand Rounds is presented by **Dr. Bryant T. Marks, Sr.**



Broadly speaking, group-based bias involves varying degrees of stereotyping (exaggerated beliefs about others), prejudice (dis/liking others), and/or discrimination (unequal treatment of others) that occur above or below conscious awareness. Scholars have labeled the subconscious form of group-based bias implicit bias. In this provocative and highly interactive presentation, Dr. Marks will describe the science behind the causes and consequences of implicit bias and its impact on individuals and healthcare outcomes. Dr. Marks will also offer practical strategies for identifying, managing, and potentially mitigating implicit bias. To get the most out of this presentation, take the Race IAT from Harvard, here:

Objectives: As a result of this training, participants will be able to provide informed responses to the following questions:

- 1. What is implicit bias?
- 2. What does implicit bias look like in the real world?
- 3. Why does implicit bias exist?
- 4. How is implicit bias measured?
- 5. How does implicit bias affect the perpetrator?
- 6. How does implicit bias affect the target of the bias?
- 7. How can implicit bias be reduced?

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
