Post Hurricane Ida Faculty Development Workshop





The LSUHSC School of Medicine's Committee on Faculty Development is offering an additional workshop to assist faculty and staff in their response,

recovery and return to work following Hurricane Ida amidst a continuing pandemic.

Recent Accomplishments from the Division of Hematology/Oncology





Third year fellow Dr. Maria G. Español, along with her mentor Dr. Maria C. Velez, were awarded a grant from the Hemophilia Foundation of America (HFA). The grant, entitled "Using Interactive Technology to Improve Patient Education and Transition of Care in an Underserved Population with Hemophilia" consists of \$7,000.00 for one year. The grant will be used to develop an interactive website for patients to increase their disease knowledge as well as learn readiness at the time to transition to the adult world.



Below is our infographic that we created for Louisiana Childhood Obesity Awareness Day that we shared with the Louisiana Legislature in June!




