

Research and Quality Improvement Initiatives from the Heart Center

- For the first time in the hospital's history, Drs. Kiran Mallula, Ernest Siwik and their team were invited to host a taped case session at PICS-AICS (Pediatric & Adult Interventional Cardiology Symposium) 2020, an international conference that was attended by over 1,000 registered delegates, from September 11-13. It involved a procedure of RVOT stenting in a small infant < 2.5 kg with unique complex anatomy. The event can be viewed here.


Update Your CV with Pediatric Course Numbers
