

Jim Cutler, PhD

Jim E. Cutler, PhD will retire on July 1, 2013. Dr. Cutler is recognized for both his dedication to teaching and for his more than 40 years of research on Candida-host interactions. This research led to the development of vaccines that enhance antibody-mediated resistance to the lifethreatening disseminated candidiasis. As a teacher, he mentored eight postdoctoral students and eleven graduate students. Furthermore, he provided guidance and research experience to over 70 undergraduate students as well as several high school students. Prior to coming to LSUHSC, Dr. Cutler was a faculty member for almost 28 years at Montana State University. There he was the recipient of numerous NIH RO1 grants, he served on NIH study sections, he was on the editorial board of ASM journals, received teaching and research awards, was Lecturer for Division F of the ASM, and he was elected Fellow of the American Academy for Microbiology. More recently, he became an AAAS Fellow in recognition for his research accomplishments. Upon leaving Montana State, Dr. Cutler was awarded Emeritus status at that institution. Dr. Cutler was recruited to the Research Institute for Children and LSU in New Orleans in 2002. While here at LSUHSC and at the RIC, Dr. Cutler was instrumental in bringing together scientists from multiple institutions in New Orleans who have an interest in medical mycology research. He continued to develop his research of the identification of new candida antigens that

elicit protective antibodies and he developed an effective experimental monoclonal antibody against candida. His work will now be continued by his associate Hong Xin, MD, PhD who is applying the experimental findings achieved by Dr. Cutler to human immunology.

The research and clinical faculty of the Department of Pediatrics appreciates his efforts and will surely miss him. We give Dr. Jim Cutler our heartiest congratulations for his successful life as a researcher and offer our best wishes for his retirement.
