<u>Dr. Rebecca Lillis</u> (Infectious Diseases) and colleagues recently published in *Post-graduate Medicine*, this paper on STI diagnoses presenting as lower GU symptoms. The team used de-identified insurance claims data and showed delayed STI antibiotic treatment and low rates of testing, which suggests late STI consideration and suboptimal diagnosis. 
