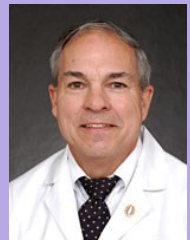

This work explores how we as practicing physicians can help reduce the likelihood that our patients are faced with that all-too-common outcome of unmanageable or overwhelming debt after seeking needed health services.

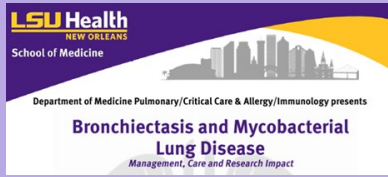
