Center Directors and Dual-PIs <u>Dr. Ashley Wennerstrom</u> and <u>Dr. Ben Springgate</u> (Community & Population Medicine) recently received word that their multiyear cooperative endeavor agreement (CEA) with the Louisiana Department of Health for \$9 million supporting the LSU Health Center for Healthcare Value and Equity, has been renewed effective July 1, 2023. Building on a record of collaboration and success since 2018, the three years of support through June 2026 (with an option to extend to June 2028) will provide at least \$9 million for the Center's efforts to expand collaborative research and evaluation, innovation, and partnerships improving health and health care for the people of Louisiana.

In a collaborative effort, members of our residency program and Pulmonary/Critical Care section recently published in Respiratory Medicine. Dr. Thomas Fox (EM/IM Resident), Dr. Michael LaNasa (Former Baton Rouge IM Resident), Dr. Bennett deBoisblanc and Dr. Matthew Lammi (Pulmonary/ Critical Care) reported on the test characteristics of 3 questionnaires for obstructive sleep apnea in a cohort of patients with pulmonary hypertension (PH): the STOP-Bang, STOP-Bang with modifications and Epworth Sleepiness Scale (ESS). STOP-Bang was equal in performance in patients with PH as compared to those without PH.
