Dr. Ashley Wennerstrom and Dr. Marcus Bachhuber (Community & Population Health) recently published a paper describing a retrospective cohort study linking Louisiana Medicaid and Louisiana state corrections release data. The team found pre-release Medicaid enrollment was associated with higher proportions of, and faster access to, a wide variety of health services compared with Medicaid enrollment post-release. Regardless of enrollment status, the study found prolonged times between release and receipt of timesensitive behavioral health services and prescription medications.
