LSU Women's Health Research Consortium

This group is designed to connect students interested in research with faculty mentors and their research ideas. While many past projects focused on

women's health, we welcome all research topics that may benefit from student involvement.

We are currently building a database of research questions and projects submitted by faculty and residents. These may include chart reviews, quality improvement (QI) projects, case reports, and literature reviews. Some early-stage learners have also expressed interest in participating in prospective studies.

Once the database is complete, it will be shared with student members of the committee, who may select topics of interest, meet with principal investigators, and decide whether to move forward. The committee will provide guidance, instructional resources, and informational meetings focused on research project completion, common barriers, and best practices, while supporting students throughout the research process.

We recognize that residents and attendings have limited time, so we created a brief project submission form to make participation quick and easy and to help connect medical students with available research opportunities.

February 26th 4-5pm - in person, Lion's Building 6th floor, small conference room 5 - **Idea Incubator** - The first in a monthly, interactive series to share ideas, get feedback, identify collaborators, or request consultation and trouble shooting. Meetings will alternate between in person and Zoom. Participants may sign up to informally present their idea.

March 2nd noon - Zoom - **Lunch and Learn** - Join for a didactic session while you eat lunch. This session will offer an overview of education scholarship, including why it matters and how to recognize the scholarship potential in work you may already be doing.

Travel/Reimbursement Corner

How is parking reimbursed for a local conference?

Although Travel Priors are not required for local conferences, you must decide in advance whether you will be requesting reimbursement for parking. If parking reimbursement is requested, the conference will follow the same guidelines as an out-of-state conference, and an approved Travel Prior is required before any expenses are paid, including the conference registration fee. For conferences held in the New Orleans Metropolitan area, both the parking expense and the conference registration fee must be processed through the Travel Voucher reimbursement process. While the conference registration fee may be placed on a P-Card, if parking is being claimed, all related expenses must follow Travel Voucher guidelines, and the conference registration fee cannot be paid until the Travel Prior has been fully approved.
