We are excited to announce that our new Pediatric Critical Care Fellowship has officially received approval from the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). This milestone marks a significant step forward in expanding advanced training opportunities and strengthening our commitment to excellence in pediatric care.

The program will begin accepting applications during the July 2026 recruitment cycle, with the inaugural class of fellows scheduled to start in July 2027. This fellowship is designed to provide comprehensive, high-quality training for physicians pursuing specialization in pediatric critical care medicine.

Dr. Joshua D. Milner is a Professor of Pediatrics and Director of the Division of Allergy, Immunology, and Rheumatology at Columbia University Irving Medical Center, where he also leads clinical services at NewYork-Presbyterian Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital. His work centers on uncovering the genetic and immunologic mechanisms underlying allergic and immune diseases. Previously a senior investigator and laboratory chief at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, Dr. Milner is an internationally recognized expert with numerous awards and publications in top-tier journals.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- To recognize relationships between genetic disruption or specific pathways and the associated clinical immunology presentations.
- To analyze the contribution of different types of genetic variation on rare and common immune system disorder risk and clinical outcomes.
- To demonstrate examples of how precision medicine could be informed by genetic analyses for patients with allergy and clinical immunology disorders.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatric provider, but it is open to all interested physicians, residents, medical students, nursing, and allied health professionals.

Foundation Reimbursement - 60 Day Deadline

The Foundation has adopted an accountable plan that meets IRS regulations. In that any reimbursement request submitted 60 days after the date of expense will be treated as taxable to the employee.
