# **Manning Family Children's Time Studies**

It's that time of year again – **Manning Family Children's Annual Physician Time Studies** will be collected over the next three weeks:

Week 1: Monday, September 15 – Sunday, September 21 Week 2: Monday, September 22 – Sunday, September 28

Week 3: Monday, September 29 - Sunday, October 5

Please follow the instructions below to generate your time studies and send them to Kelly Allerton. She will collect all of LSU Pediatrics' Faculty time studies on a weekly basis and sending to Manning Family Children's Accounting office as a group. In case you need it, Manning Family Children's Accounting office sent helpful examples and instructions.

### Generating and Printing your Weekly Time Study:

- 1. Complete your timesheet as you normally do in the LSU time tracking system.
- Once you record time at Manning Family Children's, you will see a button labeled "Print Hospital Time Studies" on the Timesheet Actions tab. Click that button each week and generate your Time Study. If needed, <u>step-by-step instructions can be</u> found here.
- 3. If the "Print Hospital Time Studies" button does not show up, save the timesheet,

- then go to the "My Timesheets" tab and click "Open Current Timesheet". This will cause a refresh and the "Print Hospital Time Studies" button will be visible on the Timesheet Actions tab.
- 4. Remember to sign and date your time study.
- 5. Send your time study weekly to Kelly <u>Allerton on</u> each of the following Mondays: September 22, 29, October 6.

### Background:

Each year the Medicare and Medicaid programs require Manning Family Children's to conduct a time study of the physician services provided at the hospital. Completion of these forms is extremely important in determining the hospital's reimbursements for resident training and administrative functions.

Dr. Colleen LeBlanc is a Pediatric Gastroenterologist at Manning Family Children's and an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans. She completed her medical education at LSU Health Sciences Center Shreveport, She pursued her Pediatric Residency at Children's National Hospital in Washington, DC, and went on to complete a Fellowship in Pediatric Gastroenterology at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. Since joining LSU Health New Orleans as a faculty member in 2019, Dr. LeBlanc has taken on several key roles. She serves as the Program Director for the Pediatric Gastroenterology Fellowship at LSU and codirects both the Eosinophilic Gastrointestinal Disorders (EGIDs) Clinic and the Pediatric Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) Clinic, both of which align with her research interests. Dr. LeBlanc is also part of ImproveCareNow, a consortium dedicated to enhancing care for pediatric IBD patients. In addition to her clinical and research responsibilities, she actively works with first and secondyear medical students in the CSI 101/102 & CSI 200, Houses Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Understand how the clinical presentation of eosinophilic esophagitis varies with age,
- Define the criteria necessary to make a diagnosis of eosinophilic esophagitis.
- Define the long-term consequences of untreated eosinophilic esophagitis.
- Understand the rationale of the different treatment options for eosinophilic esophagitis.
