Dr. Michelle Knecht is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the Division of Neonatology at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center and has been a neonatologist at Children's Hospital since 2018.

Dr. Knecht grew up in Metairie, Louisiana, and received undergraduate and medical degrees from Louisiana State University. She completed her residency in pediatrics at Duke University and a fellowship in neonatology at LSUHSC.

She is board certified in General Pediatrics and Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine by the American Board of Pediatrics. Dr. Knecht pursued a career in neonatology because she enjoyed the opportunity to care for preterm and critically ill infants, providing a positive impact on their lives from birth until hospital discharge.

Knowing the value of effective nutrition to help babies heal and grow, Dr. Knecht is the primary developer of feeding protocols utilized in the Children's Hospital NICU.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Understand neonatal hyperbilirubinemia and the importance of hyperbilirubinemia monitoring in the prevention of kernicterus.
2. Understand the notable changes from the 2022 AAP Clinical Practice Guidelines for Management of Hyperbilirubinemia in the Newborn Infant \geq 35 Weeks of Gestation.
3. Understand application of these AAP clinical practice guidelines for management of hyperbilirubinemia in newborns in the clinical care setting.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
