Monika Dietrich, MD, FAAP, is an Assistant Professor at Tulane University School of Medicine. She completed her undergraduate and medical school degrees at Michigan State University, studying both in Lansing, MI and Flint, MI. She further pursued her training in Pediatrics at Tulane-Ochsner in New Orleans and chose to stay on for Fellowship in Pediatric Infectious Diseases at Tulane as well. She enjoys seeing patients with complex infections in the hospital and clinic and is particularly interested in acclescent HIV care and atypical Mycobacterial infections, as well as care of recently immigrated children and travel visits. Her long-term, clinical translational research interests revolve around the effects of common viral infections both on the population-wide level and within particularly vulnerable subgroups. She is also participating in a number of ongoing SARS-CoV-2 research, and is the Primary Investigator of the Tulane and Children's Hospital New Orleans Moderna SARS-CoV-2 vaccine investigational trial in children 6 months old to less than 12 years.
