Topics included committing to a career in pediatrics, transitioning from medical student to resident, residency schedules, finances and residency, and work/life balance. The Pediatrics Interest Group fosters interest in pediatric careers and has served as an important recruitment resource for our own residency program.



Interested in Promotion?

The process for faculty interested in promotions for the next cycle (effective July 2025) is underway. Faculty should have received an email recently from Dr. Stephanie Taylor announcing upcoming informational workshops to review the promotions process. Interested faculty should sign up for one of these workshops.

Typically, most faculty have been in their current rank for at least 6 to 7 years by the time of their promotion effective date (i.e., in current rank at least since 2018-19 for those intending to seek promotion this cycle). Rarely, a candidate's accomplishments may allow for promotion on a shorter interval.

Additionally, any faculty considering promotion should contact Dr. Brian Barkemeyer, Pediatric Promotions Committee Chair, at bbarke@lsuhsc.edu to plan a meeting by the end of March to discuss promotion candidacy and declare an intention to seek promotion this cycle.

The promotions process requires timely adherence to promotion guidelines and packet preparation. Packet preparation requires time and involves extensive administrative support from Kelly Allerton.

Elizabeth Phillips, MD, is Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Tulane University School of Medicine. Dr. Phillips earned her medical degree from the Latin American School of Medicine, then began her Triple Board (Pediatrics, Psychiatry, and Child Psychiatry) residency training at Tulane University. She furthered her training with a fellowship in Infort and Early Childhood Psychiatry, also at Tulane University. Dr. Phillips is possionate about increasing access to care. She primarily works at the South-Central Louisiana Human Services Authority (SCLHSA) Behavbord Health Center in Lofourche Parish, where she provides in person medication management for children and adults, in both English and Spanish. Dr. Phillips is interested in developmental psychopathology, particularly in the context of maltreatment, as well as behavioral strategies for families with young children. She also hopes to increase the practice of community- and strength-based approaches for those with more serious conduct problems.
