Robin English Wins COMSEP Award



This past Friday, March 31st, was International Trans Day of Visibility. Celebrated annually, this is an opportunity to reflect on how to positively lift up and support transgender and gender diverse patients,

Teen Overdose Deaths

Despite significant reductions in adolescent alcohol, tobacco, and substance use over the last decade there has been a dramatic increase in overdose deaths in the last 3 years. Fentanyl adulterated products are significantly contributing to this tragedy. Teens dying of overdose are largely not using substances regularly or suffering from abuse. They are experimenting or using other commonly prescribed medications like stimulants that are counterfeit and contain fentanyl.

What can you do to help?

- Talk to young people about the rise in Fentanyl containing pills which can be easily obtained on the internet or through peers
- Expect Fentanyl is in any pill, medication, etc. not obtained at a pharmacy
- Learn and share with others how to safely use Naloxone to reverse an opioid overdose <u>here</u>
- Carry Naloxone which can be found in pharmacies and hospitals in New Orleans*
- Encourage youth to carry Naloxone as 40% of overdose deaths occur with a bystander present

Zachary M. Sellers, MD, PhD, is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics (Gastroenterology) at Stanford University School of Medicine. He earned his Medical degree and Doctorate of Molecular and Integrative Physiology from the University of Illinois College of Medicine Urbana-Champaign. Dr. Sellers then completed his residency at Stanford Health Care at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital, and furthered his training with clinical and research fellowships in Gastroenterology at Stanford

Dr. Sellers is the director of the CFTR Phenotyping and Theratyping Program at the Cystic Fibrosis Translational Research Laboratory at Stanford. He has additional research interests in the pathophysiological relationship between pancreatitis and intestinal diseases. His clinical focus is on gastrointestinal manifestations of cystic fibrosis developing diagnostic and therapeutic modalities to improve the gastrointestinal and liverhealth of those with cystic fibrosis.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Review common gastrointestinal, pancreatic, and liver (broadly termed "GI") complication in cystic fibrosis
- Discuss diagnostic and therapeutic options for GI complications in cystic fibrosis
 Highlight current challenges in CF therapeutics, including those specific to GI
