Reminder: Career Planning Elective

Career Planning Elective (CPE) is a 2-week elective that a third-year student completes during the Internal Medicine rotation. This is assigned centrally by the Office of UME downtown based on the student's preference. Typically, this is an outpatient experience.

COMSEP COACH Certificate Program SAVE THE DATE September 16-18, 2024 | Arlington, VA

The COMSEP Coach Certificate Program is an interactive, longitudinal course, based on the competencies of the International Federation of Coaches, that will give medical educators the skills and resources to effectively coach their learners and peers.

Why Coaching? Coaching has broad applicability and is focused on asking questions that encourage exploration and curiosity in the coachee. While mentoring is sometimes thought of as creating someone like oneself by directing them, coaching involves helping others achieve their goals by asking reflective and thoughtful questions.

Program Overview Program elements include orientation materials, welcome reception, one-and-a-half-day in person conference taught by certified coaches that will include large group sessions and peer coaching practice, longitudinal learning and practice during monthly conference calls, and a half day course consolidation and celebration at the 2024 COMSEP annual meeting.

Cost: \$2,000 for COMSEP members, \$2,500 for non-members

Brian Barkemeyer, MD, is Professor and Vice-Chair of Pediatrics in the Division of Neonatology at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center and has been a neonatologist at Children's Hospital since 1993; he has served as head of the section of neonatology at LSU since 1998. He holds the Sheila Gottschalk Professorship of Excellence in Teaching. Dr. Barkemeyer is a New Orleans native who received undergraduate and medical degrees from LSU, followed by a Pediatrics residency at LSU/Charity Hospital/Children's Hospital. He then completed his neonatology fellowship training at the combined LSU/Tulane University program. He is certified by the American Board of Pediatrics in General Pediatrics and Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine. In 2019, Dr. Barkemeyer was recognized by the Louisiana AAP with the Master Pediatrician Award.
