Rahn Kennedy Bailey, MD, DFAPA, ACP, serves as Endowed Chair of Psychiatry and Assistant Dean of Community Engagement at LSU Health Sciences Center, New Orleans. He received his medical degree from the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston. He completed his residency training in psychiatry at the University of Texas at Houston, then furthered his training with a fellowship in Forensic Psychiatry at Yale University. Dr. Bailey's career has centered on community outreach, forensic psychiatric consulting, and health disparities research. He additionally served as the 113th President of the National Medical Association. Dr. Bailey previously served as an educator and academic administrator at Meharry Medical College, Wake Forest School of Medicine, and the Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science. He transitioned to his current role in 2021.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Identify historical paradigm shifts in views of juvenile crime and gun violence.
- Discuss how minoritized adolescents are disproportionately affected by gun violence & concerns specifically addressing marginalized populations I those regards
- Explain how adolescent neurodevelopment is sensitive to both risk-taking behaviors and traumatic stress.
- Define community trauma and summarize the impacts of environmental changes on gun violence for adolescents.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
