Hayley Gans, MD, FAAP, FPIDS, FIDSA, is a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at Stanford University Medical Center. She spends her clinical time on the Pediatric Infectious Diseases service and Co-directs the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Program for Immunocompromised Hosts.

She serves as the Director of Fellowship Education for the Department of Pediatrics, The Chair of the Association of Pediatric Program Directors (APPD) Fellowship Executive Committee, and the Fostering URM Education Leadership (FUEL) program. She is a founding Committee member for the program Promoting Resident Experiences in the Subspecialties at Stanford (PRESS), bringing URM residents to

rotate in subspecialty electives. Dr. Gans has focused on subspecialty training, exploring, and publishing on recruitment, leadership, well-being, scholarship, curriculum, and learning climate.

She serves as a mentor for several undergraduates and graduates, as well as faculty, running a core curriculum and professional development course for all fellows in the Department of Pediatrics at Stanford. Additionally, she has fostered a fellowship community through shared learning within the subspecialty leadership, promoting faculty development and supporting scholarship within the medical education field. Dr. Gans has received several awards for her mentoring and scholarly efforts. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:
