
Congratulations to our stellar class of graduates! We will miss you all!

Sarah Labuda, MD, MPH, CTropMed, is the medical director of immunizations and child health programs at the Arkansas Department of Health and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the Section of Infectious Diseases at University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences/Arkansas Children's Hospital in Little Rock, Arkansas. She completed medical school at Texas A&M University; Pediatric residency at UAMS/ACH in Little Rock, Arkansas; Master of Public Health at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, MD; and Pediatric Infectious Diseases Fellowship at the joint Tulane/LSU/Ochsner fellowship program in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Dr. Labuda is the 2024 Ralph V. Platou, MD, Visiting Professor as part of the Tulane University Pediatrics Residency program. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe public health roles and systems at the local, national, and international level
- Understand the role of the physician in the context of a systems-based practice
- Give examples of how pediatricians can strengthen health care systems to ensure equitable care for all patients


