Amanda Messer, MD, is Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the Division of Hospitalist Medicine in the Department of Pediatrics at LSU Health Sciences Center. She also serves as the LSU Pediatric Hospital Medicine Fellowship Program Director, the first and only pediatric hospital medicine fellowship in Louisiana. Dr. Messer completed medical school and her pediatrics residency at LSU Health Sciences Center, and then pursued additional training at Baylor College of Medicine's Pediatric Hospital Medicine fellowship. She is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Hospital Medicine.

Chelsey Sandlin, MD, is Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the Division of Hospitalist Medicine in the Department of Pediatrics at LSU Health Sciences Center. She also serves as the LSU Pediatrics Residency Program Director. Dr. Sandlin completed medical school and her pediatrics residency at LSU Health Sciences Center, and she is board-certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Hospital Medicine. In 2022, she was awarded the LSU Suskind Outstanding Pediatric Faculty award, for making an outstanding academic contribution to the education, research, clinical service, and advocacy missions of the LSU Department of Pediatrics.
