CHNOLA Time Studies - Please Send Week One

It's that time of year again —**CHNOLA's Annual Physician Time Studies** will be collected over the next several weeks:

Week 1: Monday, October 7 – Sunday, October 13

Week 2: Monday, October 14 - Sunday, October 20

Week 3: Monday, October 21 - Sunday, October 27

Please follow the instructions below to generate your time studies and send them to <u>Kelly Allerton</u>. She will collect all of LSU Pediatrics' Faculty time studies on a weekly basis and send them to CHNOLA as a group.

Generating and Printing your Weekly CHNOLA Time Study

- 1. Complete your timesheet as you normally do in the LSU time tracking system.
- 2. Once you record time at Children's Hospital, you will see a button labeled "Print Hospital Time Studies" on the Timesheet Actions tab. Click that button each week and generate your Time Study. If needed, step-by-step-by-step-instructions can be found here.
- 3. If the "Print Hospital Time Studies" button does not show up, save the timesheet, then go to the "My Timesheets" tab and click "Open Current Timesheet". This will cause a refresh and the "Print Hospital Time Studies" button will be visible on the Timesheet Actions tab.
- 4. Remember to sign and date your time study.
- 5. Send your time study weekly to **Kelly Allerton** on each of the following Mondays: October 14, 21, 28.

Background:

Each year the Medicare and Medicaid programs require Children's Hospital to conduct a time study of the physician services provided at the Hospital. Completion of these forms is mandatory and important in determining the hospital's reimbursements from these programs.

- 5 free coaching sessions (per issue)

- Parenting, career, wellness, health, skills, etc.
- Counseling (generally 5 sessions per issue)
- Unlimited, in-the-moment support from a licensed professional
- Legal support
- Fertility support
- Wellbeing assessments
- E-Courses, and more

In addition, all physicians, including residents and fellows, can access 5 free counseling sessions (per issue) through BetterHelp at BetterHelp.com/lcmchealth

• This benefit can also be used by anyone in your household, per issue.

"Per issue" means you could have 5 sessions working on developing effective strategies to cope with stress (issue 1), another two sessions at a later date about anxiety around an anticipated transition (issue 2), and then four sessions exploring your relationship with parental figures (issue 3), etc etc. "Household" means anyone you consider to be in your immediate family. This could be a roommate or spouse who shares your home or a family member who lives elsewhere, even in another state. If a loved one's distress is causing you distress, they can use these resources.

These resources are all entirely confidential. No one at LCMC or LSU will know who logged in or what resources were accessed; the LCMC code simply opens the menu of resources available to the organization.
