Ann Kulungowski, MD, is Associate Professor of Surgery at the University of Colorado School of Medicine and Children's Hospital Colorado. Dr. Kulungowski earned her medical degree from the University of Texas School of Medicine. During her surgical residency at University of Colorado Hospital, she also served as the Jane and Stuart Weitzman Fellow in Vascular Anomalies at Children's Hospital in Boston. She further specialized her practice with additional fellowships in pediatric surgery and surgical critical care at Children's Hospital Colorado.

As well as being active in the education of surgical learners, Dr. Kulungowski has shared her expertise in vascular anomalies through book chapters and numerous national and international presentations. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Fertility support
- Wellbeing assessments
- E-Courses, and more

In addition, all physicians, including residents and fellows, can access 5 free counseling sessions (per issue) through BetterHelp at BetterHelp.com/lcmchealth

 This benefit can also be used by anyone in your household, per issue.

"Per issue" means you could have 5 sessions working on developing effective strategies to cope with stress (issue 1), another two sessions at a later date about anxiety around an anticipated transition (issue 2), and then four sessions exploring your relationship with parental figures (issue 3), etc etc. "Household" means anyone you consider to be in your immediate family. This could be a roommate or spouse who shares your home or a family member who lives elsewhere, even in another state. If a loved one's distress is causing you distress, they can use these resources.

These resources are all entirely confidential. No one at LCMC or LSU will know who logged in or what resources were accessed; the LCMC code simply opens the menu of resources available to the organization.


