Gary Duhon, MD, MPH, is Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in LSUHSC New Orleans Department of Pediatrics. He also serves as the Department's Division Chief of Pediatric Critical Care and Service Line Chief of Pediatric Critical Care at Manning Family Children's.

Dr. Duhon earned his medical degree from LSUHSC New Orleans and completed his pediatric residency training at LSU in New Orleans. He furthered his training in pediatric critical care with a fellowship at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill and additionally earned a Master of Public Health degree. Underscoring his commitment to ethical medical practice, Dr. Duhon completed a Bioethics Intensive Educational Course at the Kennedy Institute and Georgetown University. Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe the process and regulations for determining death.
- Describe advances in organ procurement such as normothermic regional perfusion (NRP).
- Explain the ethical concerns in organ procurement procedures.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatric provider, but it is open to all interested physicians, residents, medical students, nursing, and allied health professionals.


Department Biostatistician
