Adrienne Savant, MD, MS, is Professor of Pediatrics and Vice-Chair of Education in the Department of Pediatrics at Tulane University School of Medicine. She also serves as the Service Line Chief of Pulmonology at Children's Hospital New Orleans. Dr. Savant earned her medical degree at Eastern Virginia Medical School and completed her pediatric residency at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. She furthered her training at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center with a fellowship in pediatric pulmonology. She also earned a masters in Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety from Northwestern University.

Before joining the Tulane and CHNOLA faculty, Dr. Savant spent her academic medicine career at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine and Lurie Children's Hospital. She is a national leader in the study and treatment of cystic fibrosis, regularly contributing at regional and national meetings, in publications, and writing books and book chapters.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Create a model relating the key factors contributing to the increased life expectancy for people with cystic fibrosis

 Associate clinical outcomes from newborn screening for cystic fibrosis with delayed diagnosis/treatment and disparities
