Meaning in work is also strongly related to the risk of physician burnout. In a large study in 2009, Dr. Shanafelt (Mayo Clinic) asked 500 physicians what aspect of their work was most meaningful?


Each individual derived meaning from various activities such as teaching, leadership, patient care or research. Evidence indicated that physicians who spent 20% of their work life on a meaningful activity had half the burnout rate as those that did not!

Results of Wellness Survey March 2024 on time 1. How much time do you spend on your passion at work?


2. What areas are the most time consuming at work?

Neha Santucci, MD, is the director of the Disorders of Gut-Brain Interaction Program at the Neurogastroenterology and Motility Center at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center and an associate professor of pediatrics. She is a physician-scientist with an NIH K23 award, with research focus on understanding risk factors and mechanisms contributing to the development of pediatric functional abdominal pain disorders and develop new treatment strategies targeting neuromodulation. She is the Chair for the North American Society for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition (NASPGHAN) Integrative Medicine Special Interest Group and the Neurogastroenterology and Motility Section Councilor for the American Gastroenterology Association (AGA) Institute Council and the American Neurogastroenterology and Motility Society Councilor. Dr. Santucci completed her Pediatrics residency at State University of New York at Buffalo. She then furthered her training with a fellowship in Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology, and Nutrition through Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at Children's Hospital New Orleans.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Understand the diagnosis, pathophysiology and disparities in care for children with pediatric disorders of gut-brain interaction (DGBI)
- Familiarize with different therapeutic options for treatment of pediatric DGBI
- Promote a multidisciplinary "whole-person" approach to care and adapt in settings with limited resources
