LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center and Cancer Crusaders commit \$500,000 to advance canOcer research, education and outreach efforts in Louisiana

October 14, 2024 – New Orleans, La. - LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center and Cancer Crusaders have committed \$500,000 for state-wide outreach, education and clinical cancer research. This marks one of the largest donor agreements between the volunteer-run Cancer Crusaders and the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center specific to research, community outreach and engagement.

The LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center will utilize the funding to support its mission by:

- Developing a 3-year fellowship program called *The Cancer Crusaders Cancer Research Fellowship Program* to help develop a pipeline of the next generation of cancer researchers. This program will host three fellows in LSU Health New Orleans' graduate programs.
- 2. In conjunction with the LSU Health New Orleans School of Public Health, developing and implementing the multi-generational ForeSee Community Study (Comprehensive Cancer Community Cohort). This study and associated programs will help the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center better identify the causes of cancer among Louisianians and why they differ by parish. While each patient's journey is unique, the ability to reach specific geographic areas across Louisiana allows the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center to better understand each community's needs, culture, and access to cancer care.
- 3. Opening the *Cancer Crusaders Cancer Risk Clinic* at University Medical Center in New Orleans. This specialized medical clinic will transform the way we work with patients by focusing on education and screenings specific to viral, genetic and environmental impacts of cancer. There also will be a virtual outreach component within the clinic.

"The generous ongoing support of Cancer Crusaders and this new commitment underscore the vital role of community collaborations in enhancing access to cutting edge medical care for everyone throughout Louisiana," said Joe W. Ramos, Director of the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center. "Together with our dedicated partners, we are committed to driving innovative research and impactful education initiatives that will save countless lives."

By investing in cancer care, research, education, and community outreach, the LSU LCMC Health Cancer Center and Cancer Crusaders will make a difference to better prevent, detect, and treat cancer, as well as educating the next generation of researchers in Louisiana.
