Formal Course Responsibilities—Clinical Teaching

Undergraduate: Serve as mentor of undergraduate students by allowing “shadowing” in the operating room and clinic, furthering interest in medicine in general and otolaryngology as a specialty

Medical: Teach third and fourth year medical students in the operating room by having them observe and participate in surgical procedures but also engage them in informal question and answer sessions regarding various otolaryngologic topics. The students attend surgery at Children's Hospital 3-5 days per week for 2-week rotations at the third year level and one week for fourth year students as their elective. These students and those in their clinical pediatric rotation attend clinics at Children's Hospital and the Metairie Center. They observe and participate in evaluation and management of pediatric otolaryngology specialty clinics, as well as multidisciplinary cleft-palate and craniofacial clinic, and the

new vascular anomaly clinic. Physical examination skills are emphasized but the students are asked to contribute to the decision making process. Attendance at these clinics is 4-5 days per week.

Led informal discussions regarding various otolaryngologic topics for medical students while displaced to Baton Rouge by Hurricane Katrina, September and October 2005 prior to clinics

Participate in the LSU Mentor Program as a representative of the department for students who may be interested in Otolaryngology as specialty.

Residents: Instruction and supervision of house officers at the second and third years of their otolaryngology training occurs daily in the operating room and clinics. The residents are taught management of special otolaryngologic care of pediatric patients as well as otolaryngologic care of special pediatric patients
