

Curriculum Renewal Committee

The charge to the Curriculum Renewal Committee is continuous quality improvement of the medical school educational program. The committee meets this responsibility by conducting periodic curriculum reviews, incorporating recommendations from the Curriculum Steering Committee and feedback from various data sources and other curriculum committees (e.g., students, faculty, performance data). This committee has the authority to consider and implement minor changes to the curriculum and to recommend major changes to the Curriculum Steering Committee. The committee meets as frequently as required, typically at least quarterly.

The committee is comprised of faculty members from basic science and clinical departments and up to 6 student representatives from the 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year classes. The Associate Dean for Undergraduate Medical Education serves in an ex-officio, non-voting capacity.
