Patrice Evers, MD, is the Suzanne Schaefer Chair in Primary Care and Chief of General Pediatrics for the Tulane University Department of Pediatrics. Dr. Evers earned her medical degree from the University of Wisconsin, then completed her Pediatrics Residency at Tulane University.

William Morgan, MD, is Assistant Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the LSUHSC Department of Pediatrics. Dr. Morgan earned his medical degree from the University of Mississippi School of Medicine. He then completed his Pediatric Residency at University of Mississippi Hospital and Clinics. After serving as a community physician in Mississippi and Alabama, Dr. Morgan joined the faculty of LSUHSC in 2016.

Both Dr. Evers and Dr. Morgan practice as General Pediatricians at CHNOLA's Academic Clinic, where they train pediatric residents and medical students from both LSUHSC and Tulane University.

2. understand why the bilirubin guidelines were changed and how to implement the new guidelines
3. explain which car seats should be used for infants and children as they grow.
