John Weiner, MD, is the CHNOLA Pediatric Visiting Professor for 2023. Dr. Weiner completed medical school at Tulane University, residency at Duke University, and pediatric urology fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine/Texas Children's Hospital. He is currently Head of the Section of Pediatric Urology and Professor of Urologic Surgery and Pediatrics at Duke University School of Medicine. Dr. Weiner's primary research interest involves health outcomes in patients with spina bifida. He has served in national leadership positions in pediatric urology including President of the Society of Fetal Urology, Executive Council of Society for Pediatric Urology, and the Examination Committee of the American Board of Urology. He is currently on the Board of Directors of the Spina Bifida Association.

Objectives: At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe how spina bifida can negatively affect bladder and renal function across the lifespan.
- Distinguish between proactive and reactive medical management of neurogenic bladder in patients with spina bifida.
- Explain surgical management of neurogenic bladder in patients with spina bifida.

Intended audience: This activity is specifically directed towards the pediatrician, but it is open to all other interested physicians, residents, medical students, and allied health professionals.
