Drs. Ryan Pasternak and **Kayla Phelps** are being spolighted this month for their extraoridnary work with the LCMC Health System.



He then completed a fellowship in Adolescent Medicine at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. Dr. Pasternak is board-certified in Adolescent Medicine and Pediatrics. He also serves as an Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics, Division Head of General Ambulatory Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, and the Nick Gagliano Professor of Ambulatory Pediatrics at LSU Health New Orleans.

Tina Simpson, MD, MPH, is board-certified in Adolescent Medicine and Pediatrics. She earned her medical degree from the University of Alabama School of Medicine and her Masters of Public Health from the University of Alabama at Birmingham. She completed her residency and fellowship training at UAB as well. In October 2022, Dr. Simpson joined the faculty at Tulane University as Professor of Pediatrics, Section Chief of Adolescent Medicine, and the Chief Clinical Diversity Officer for the School of Medicine.
